Since locating its research and production facility in Southern California 20 years ago, expanding from its Calgary headquarters, precision component manufacturer **Omni-Lite Industries Canada** has invested approximately \$30 million in equipment and infrastructure. With 50 full-time employees and approximately 100 vendors, Omni-Lite's Cerritos operation has invested an additional \$20 million in the local economy to develop new products for the aerospace, specialty automotive and sports and recreational industries, servicing Fortune 500 firms such as Boeing, Airbus, Alcoa, Ford, Caterpillar, Borg Warner, Bosch, Nike and Adidas. Over this period, the company completed \$65 million in sales, with 30% being exports to Asia.

Where do you get all that energy?



- Canada is the United States' largest and most secure supplier of oil, natural gas, electricity and a leading supplier of uranium
- In 2009, Canada and the U.S. established the *Clean Energy Dialogue* to strengthen bilateral collaboration on clean energy technologies and seeks solutions for reducing greenhouse gas emissions
- 90% of Canada's energy exports go to the U.S.

Petroleum

- Canadian oil exports to the U.S. totaled \$72.5 billion
- Canada supplies nearly 23% of all U.S. crude oil imports

Electricity

- The U.S. and Canada share an integrated electricity grid and supply almost all of each other's electricity
- Canada exported almost \$2 billion worth of electricity to the U.S.
- Canada supplies approximately ¼ of the uranium used in U.S. nuclear power plants, which provides over 5% of the total U.S. supply of electricity

Natural gas

- Canada supplies 12% of the natural gas consumed in the U.S.
- Canada exported \$10 billion in natural gas to the U.S.
- U.S.–Canada natural gas trade totaled \$13.4 billion
